



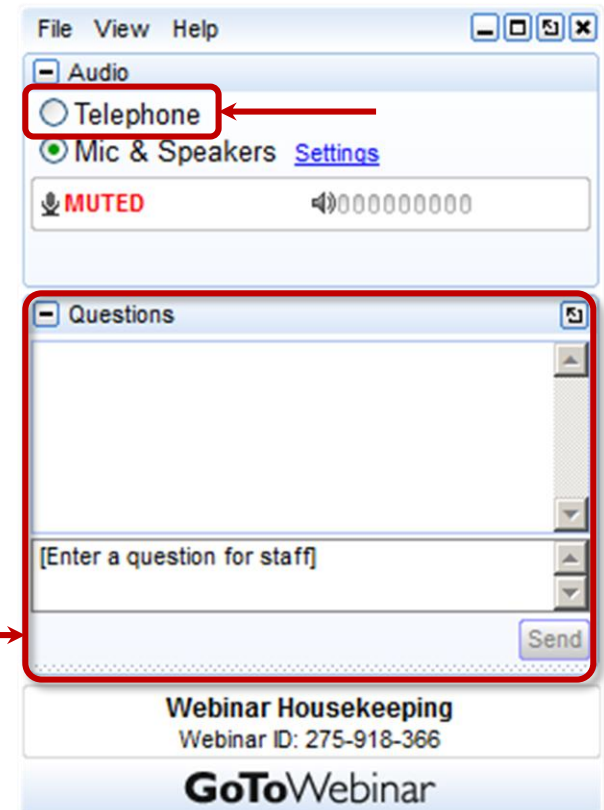

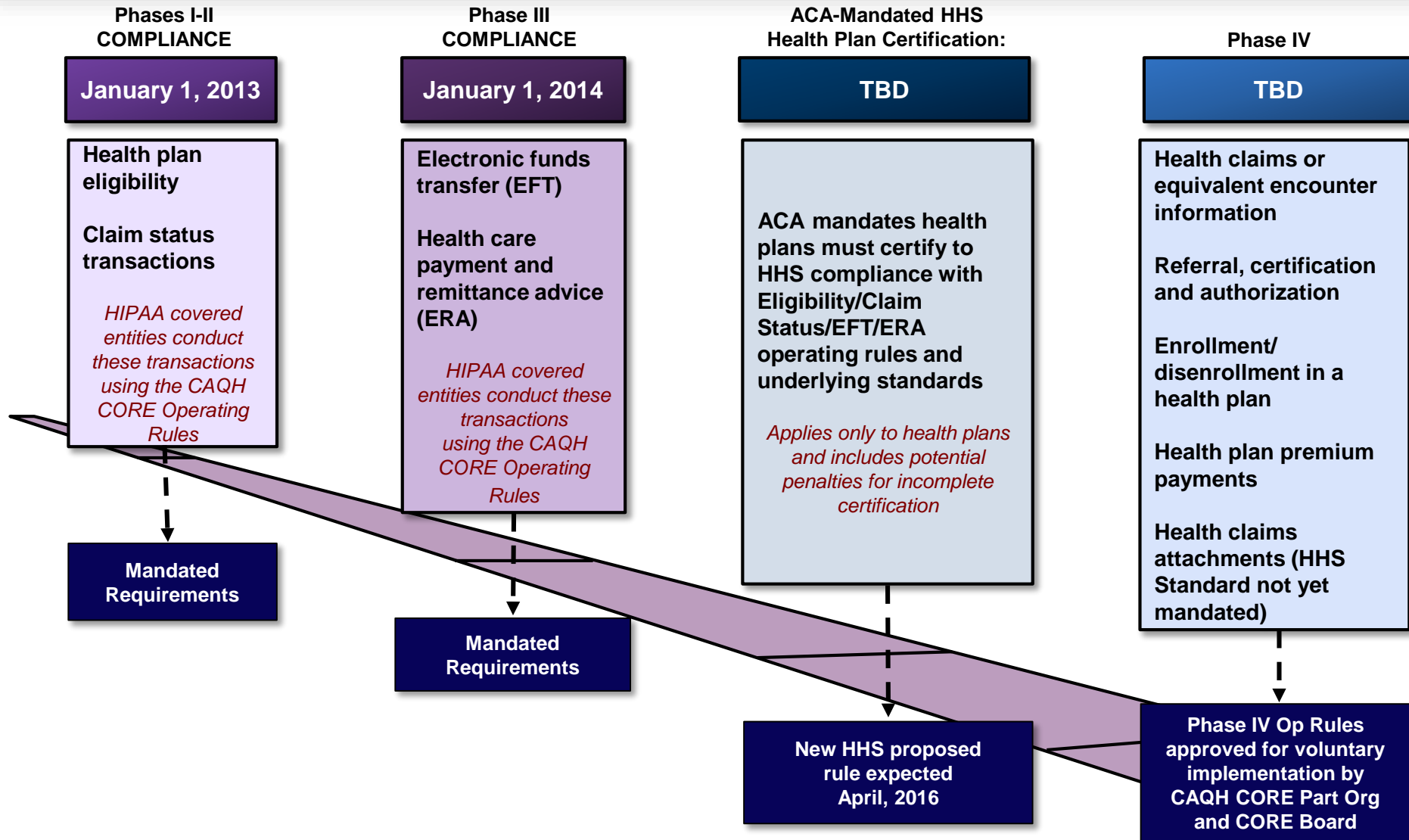

# Phase IV CAQH CORE Operating Rules Next Steps

## NCVHS

CAQH CORE updated NCVHS on the status of the Phase IV Operating Rules (earlier hearing and letter)

CAQH CORE testifies before NCVHS Review Committee on the Phase IV CAQH CORE Operating Rules in February 2016

As appropriate, NCVHS could make an adoption recommendation to the HHS Secretary



## HHS

HHS may publish a regulation in the Federal Register once it determines what is appropriate for Federal mandate

A public comment period (60 days or more) would follow publication of any regulation whereby entities can submit comments on the regulation to CMS/HHS



## Industry

HHS will address any public comments to the regulation, and will require industry to implement the operating rules, usually within two years of publication of a final regulation

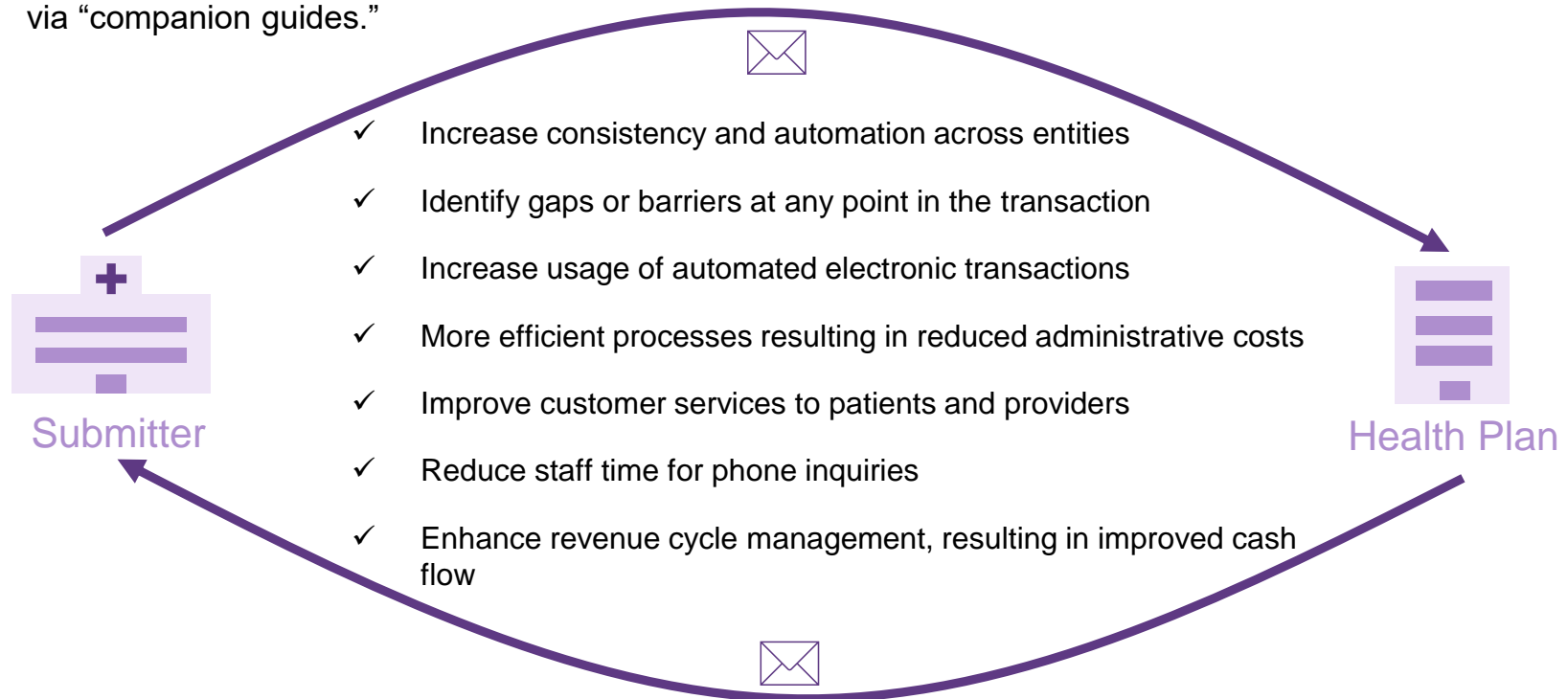

# Impact of Phase IV CAQH CORE Operating Rules

*Rules address four HIPAA transactions including Claims, Prior Authorization, Enrollment, & Premium Payment*

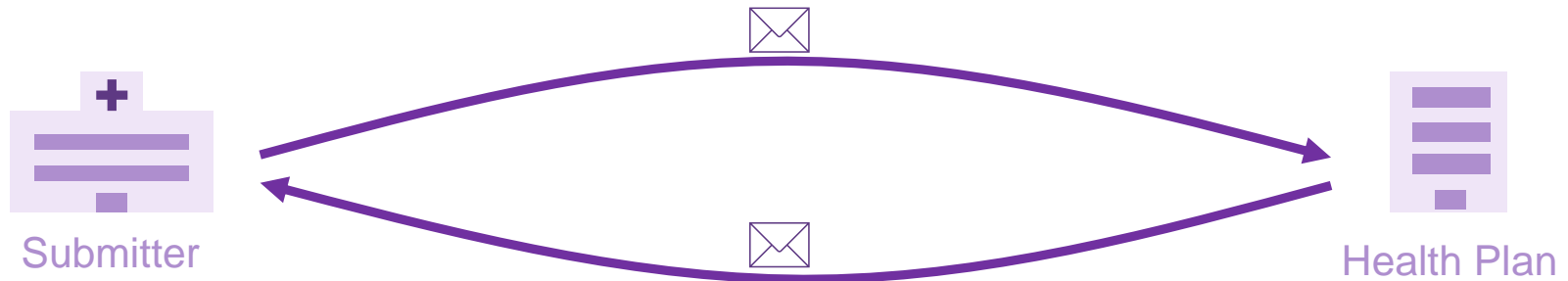
- Offering at least one common method of **connectivity** (i.e., a “safe harbor”) among entities transmitting data electronically.
- A minimal amount of time for **system availability** to receive and send data.
- An **acknowledgement** to ensure the transaction has been received, has not been lost between entities, and will be addressed.
- Required **response times** for acknowledgement and processing for both real-time and large record “batch” submissions.
- A common format that entities must use when providing information about their proprietary data exchange systems via “companion guides.”



# Batch Processing Mode Response Time Requirements

Batch Processing Mode Response Time requirements specify the overall length of elapsed time from when a transaction is sent to a health plan and when the acknowledgement(s) or response to the transaction is available for pick up (retrieval) by the sender.

- 1 Sent by 9 pm ET on a business day



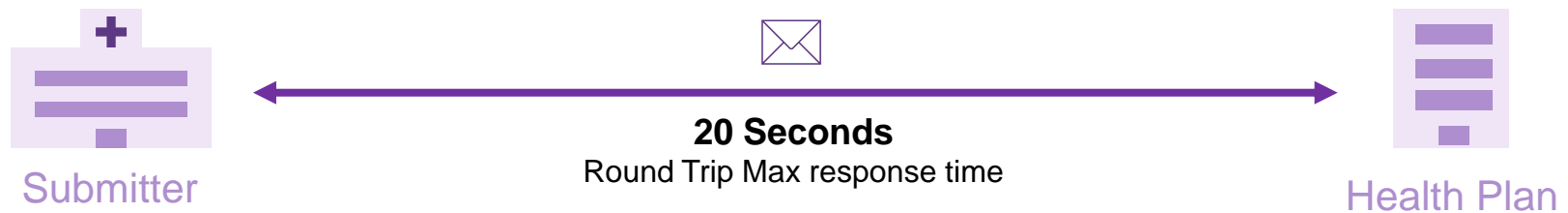
- 2 Available by 7 am ET within specified # of business days

# Real Time Processing Mode Response Time Requirements

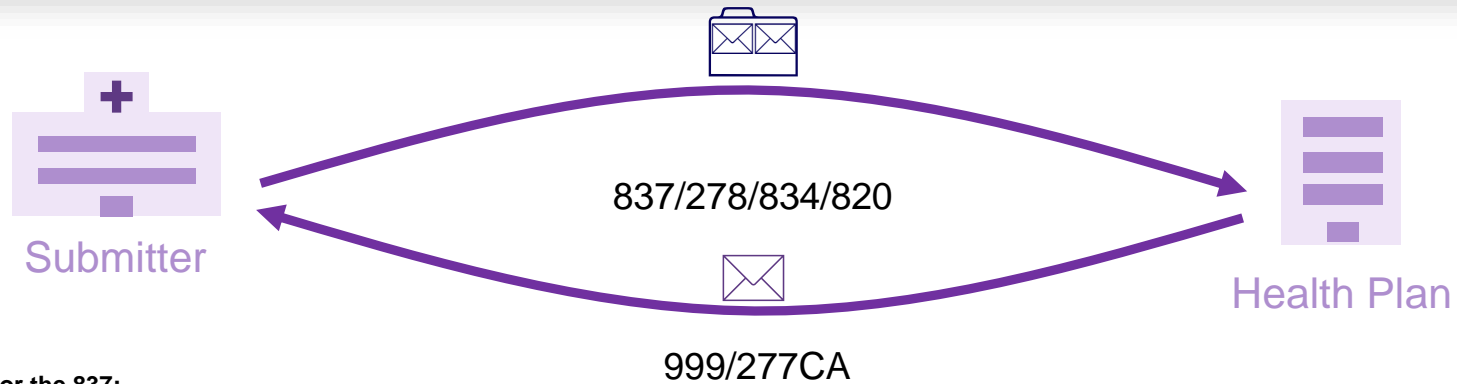
Real Time Processing Mode Response Time requirements specify the overall length of elapsed time from when a provider/health plan purchaser (sender) sends a transaction to a health plan and the related response transaction is received by the sender.

# Batch Acknowledgement Requirements



## Requirements for the 837:

- A health plan must return an ASC X12C v5010 999 for each Functional Group of any ASC X12N v5010 837 Transaction Set to indicate that the Functional Group was either accepted, accepted with errors, or rejected and to specify for each included ASC X12N v5010 837 Transaction Set that the Transaction Set was either accepted, accepted with errors, or rejected
- A health plan must acknowledge each claim received in any institutional, professional, or dental ASC X12N v5010 837 Transaction Set using the ASC X12N v5010 277CA unless previous processing resulted in a rejection of the Interchange or a Transaction Set in a Functional Group

## Requirements for the 278:

- An entity must return an ASC X12C v5010 999 for each Functional Group of ASC X12N v5010 278 Request or Response transactions to indicate that the Functional Group(s) was either accepted, accepted with errors, or rejected to specify for each included ASC X12N v5010 278 Request or Response transaction set that the transaction set was either accepted, accepted with errors, or rejected

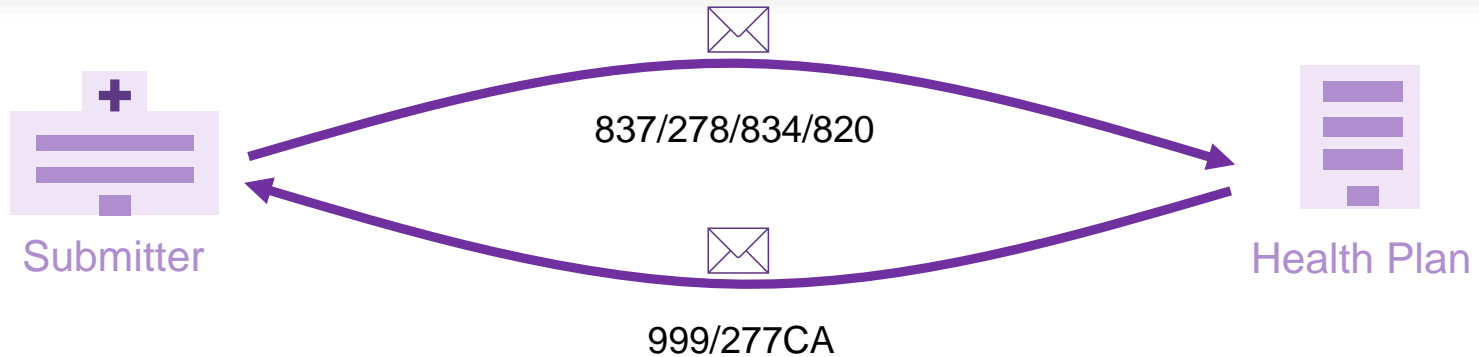
## Requirements for the 834 & 820:

- A health plan must return an ASC X12C v5010 999 for any Functional Group of any ASC X12N v5010 834 Benefit Enrollment & Maintenance Transaction Set or 820 Health Plan Premium Payment & Remittance Advice Transaction Set to indicate if the Functional Group is accepted, accepted with errors, or rejected

# Real Time Acknowledgement Requirements



When a claim is submitted in real time processing mode without adjudication a health plan

- must return an ASC X12C v5010 999 only when the Functional Group is rejected
- must return an ASC X12N v5010 277CA only when the Functional Group is accepted or accepted with errors

A health plan must return one response to an ASC X12N v5010 278 request: either an ASC X12C v5010 999 rejection or an ASC X12N v5010 278 response

A health plan must return an ASC X12C v5010 999 for any Functional Group of any ASC X12N v5010

- 834 Benefit Enrollment & Maintenance Transaction Set, or
- 820 Health Plan Premium Payment & Remittance Advice Transaction Set

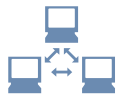

# System Availability Requirements

The System Availability requirements establish the amount of time a system must be available to process the specified transactions:



Minimum of **86 percent system availability** (per calendar week)



Provide **one week** advance notice on non-routine downtime



Publish regularly scheduled **downtime**



Provide information within **one hour** of emergency downtime

When an entity publishes a Companion Guide, the CAQH CORE Companion Guide requirements establish the format and flow of Companion Guides

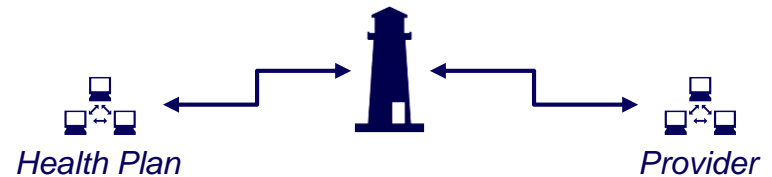

### Other key rule requirements:

- Rule applicable to HIPAA mandated ASC X12N v5010 837, 278, 834, 820 transactions
- Transport Layer Security (SSL minimum/TLS instead of SSL when required by HIPAA covered entity's security policy)
- Single Message Envelope Standard (SOAP v1.2)
- Single Submitter Authentication Method (X.509)
- Normative Message Envelope Metadata
- Standard CORE-specified Schema (.xsd)
- Standard CORE-specified Web Services Description Language (.wsdl)
- Transaction Specific Required/Optional Processing Modes
- Standard Payload Type Identifiers for each transaction for each processing mode
- Process for maintaining Processing Mode and Payload Type Identifiers

## Safe Harbor

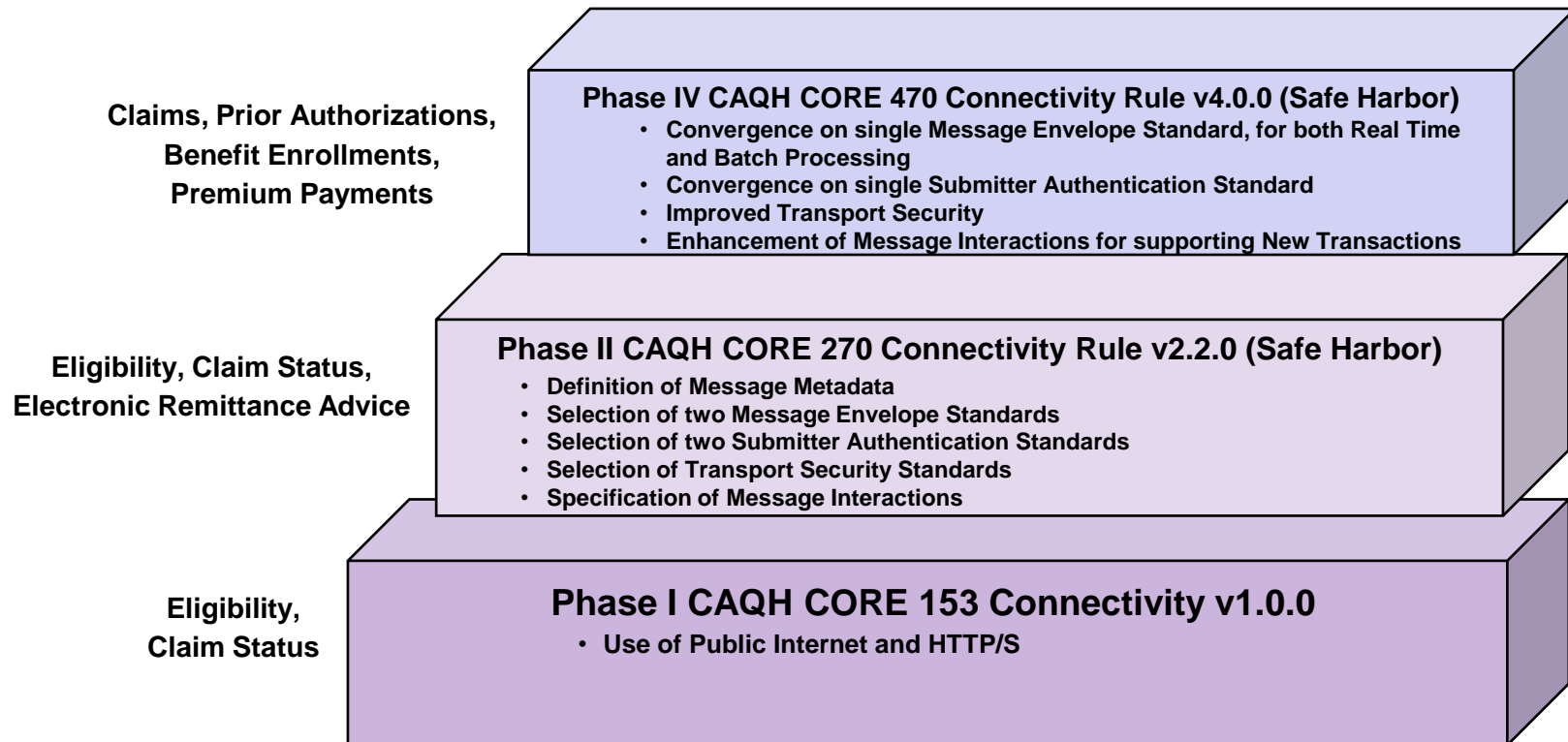


**Enables trading partners to use different communications and security methods than what is specified in rule:**

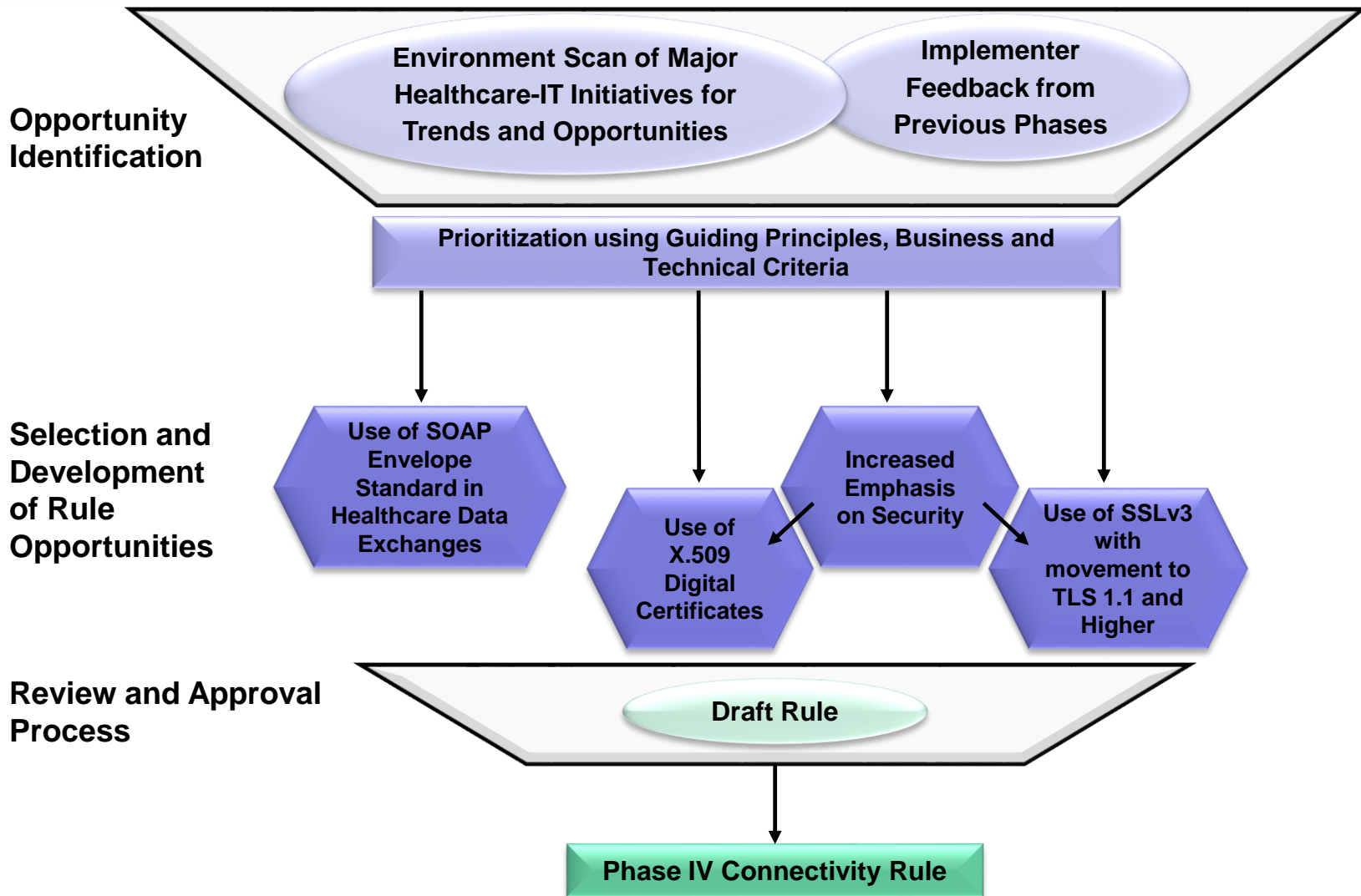
- HIPAA covered entities must support CORE rule requirements for real time and batch processing modes
- Can offer other communications and security methods
- Does not require trading partners to deimplement any existing connectivity methods not compliant with CORE rule

# What is Voluntary CORE Certification?



*The gold standard in certifying administrative simplification conformance, CORE Certification is the most robust and widely-recognized industry program of its kind. Its multi-layered approach assures an independent, industry-developed confirmation of conformance with operating rules and underlying standards.*

Requirements developed by broad, multi-stakeholder representation through transparent discussion and polling process – **Conformance is defined by industry, for industry**

Requires conformance testing by third party testing vendors that are experts in EDI and testing

CAQH CORE serves as a neutral, non-commercial administrator:

- Authorizes the conformance testing vendors
- Reviews and approves the Certification applications and conformance test reports before Certification Seal is awarded

# Phase IV CORE Certification

**Certification Test Suites** list the specific tests (test scripts) that an entity or a product must pass in order to demonstrate conformance with CAQH CORE Operating Rules.

The Phase IV CAQH CORE Certification Test Suite was developed and **approved** by CAQH CORE Participating Organizations as part of the Phase IV CAQH CORE Operating Rule development and voting process.

CORE-authorized Testing Vendor, Edifecs, is currently building a platform that implements and automates the Phase IV CAQH CORE Certification Test Suite and the required test scripts.

**Phase IV CORE Certification** will be offered in late summer, 2016.

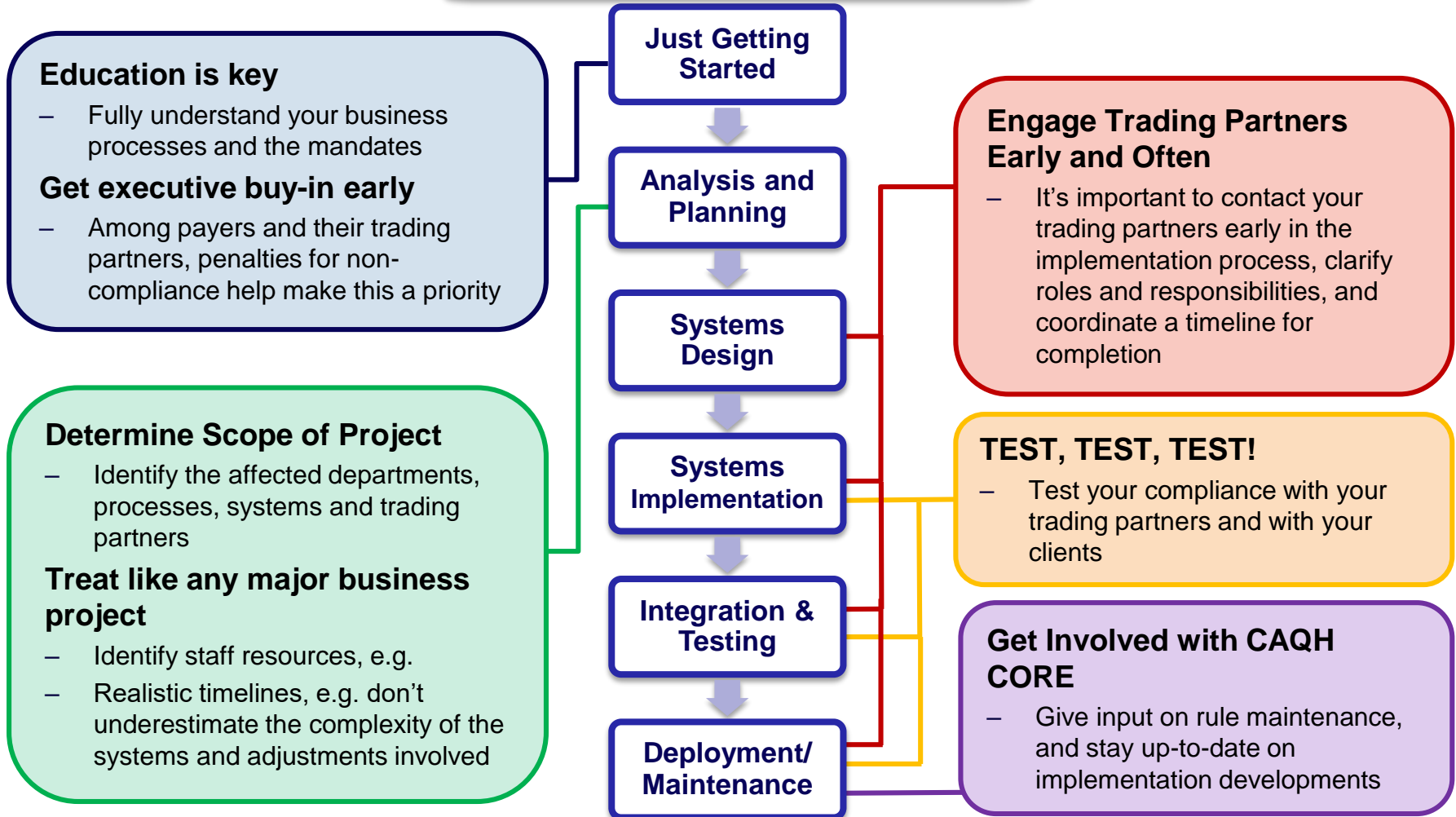
# Value of Implementing the Phase IV CAQH CORE Voluntary Operating Rules

**1. What is CAQH CORE?**

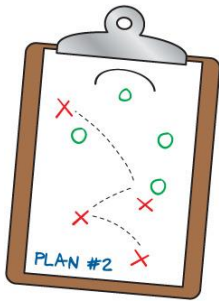
The Committee on Operating Rules for Information Exchange (CORE) is a multi-stakeholder initiative of CAQH. CAQH CORE was established in 2005 with the mission to build consensus among healthcare industry stakeholders on a set of operating rules that facilitate administrative interoperability between providers and health plans.

Since its inception, CAQH CORE has been structured around a model that operating rules authoring entities should take the responsibility of going above and beyond authorship to help drive adoption. To do this, CAQH CORE applies an integrated model in which CAQH CORE:

- Develops operating rules through broad-based stakeholder input that supports using standards.
- Develops and offers a certification program that ensures operating rules are objectively and rigorously tested and, thus, there is a solid base of early implementers.
- Builds broad-based awareness of the operating rules.
- Provides in-depth, detailed technical knowledge and assistance through early adopters.
- Promotes operating rules adoption by a majority of all stakeholders.

# Phase IV Implementation Support

As with previous Phases, over the next few months CAQH CORE will roll out a set of Phase IV CAQH CORE Operating Rules education resources and implementation tools to support industry implementation of the new operating rules

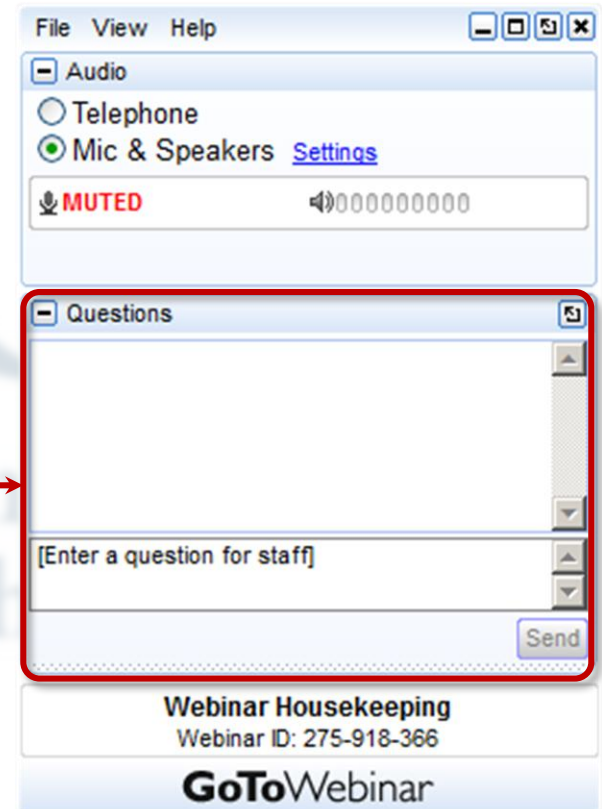

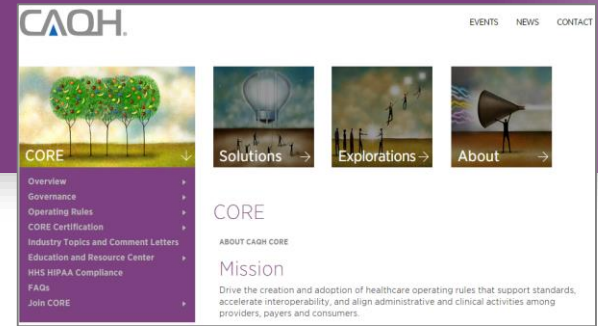
